## School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

February 10, 2017

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2015-16 educational progress for Robichaud High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2016-17 year, no new Priority or Focus schools were named; some Priority or Focus schools did exit their status because they met the exit criteria. New Reward schools were identified using school rankings and Beating the Odds information. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Robichaud High School faces some academic challenges. Student proficiency in math is low. However, our proficiency in reading is growing closer to the state average for African American students, but we have to continue to improve to reach the state average overall. Our school has ensured our alignment with the state curriculum through the use of Rubicon Atlas. Teachers are collaborating and using common assessments across the school. Content area coaches are assisting with improving instructional rigor. In addition, we are using Read 180, and Math 180 to close the achievement gap in reading and math. Our restorative practices liaison engages with students in circles to improve the culture of the building and reduce suspensions.



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State law requires that we also report additional information:

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Robichaud High School is part of the Westwood Community School District, and is the only traditional high school for the district. Westwood Community Schools is also a school of choice district, in which students from across Wayne County can register to attend our school during the open enrollment windows.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The school improvement plan is a part of a continuous cycle of improvement. We are working with academic coaches, and using tiered interventions of support to improve academic achievement.

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE SCHOOL

Robichaud High School is located within the Westwood Community School District. Robichaud serves students in grades 9-12, and offers programs such as New Tech and the Academy of Engineering. Our staff participates in weekly professional learning communities looking at student data, growth, achievement and best instructional practices.

4. CORE CURRICULUM

Robichaud High School’s curriculum is aligned with the Michigan Merit Curriculum (MMC). Teachers access the curriculum through Rubicon Atlas, so they can commonly plan, pace and assess the content. The core curriculum can be accessed in the main office.

5. AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS

Students at Robichaud took the NWEA assessment three times during the year in Math and English Language Arts. The growth data is below:

### 6. NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

Robichaud High School held parent teacher conferences two times during the year. 75 parents, or 20% of the parents attended the fall conferences. 50 parents, or 14% of the parents attended the spring parent teacher conferences. Staff reached out via phone and letter to reach 100% of the parents regarding their student’s progress.

### 7. Post Secondary Enrollment

Robichaud High School students participated in dual enrollment at the University of Michigan Dearborn, in which 5 students were enrolled. Each student who was enrolled earned credit for the course they were enrolled in. International Baccalaureate courses were not offered during the 15-16 school year. Students have the option to take AP courses at another high school in our consortium, but no students chose to participate.

Our school continues to work with students to take them from where they are to where they need to be academically, and socially. We provide an environment where all students can learn and be successful. We believe in our students, and push them to set high goals so that they are college and career ready. We instill the vision of pride, promise and perseverance each and every day. Our school continues to work diligently to improve academically and ensure our students reach the highest levels of success. We appreciate the support and trust granted to us by our families and the community.
